What is Sustainable Futures?



To make sure health and social care services are right for people, we have the Renfrewshire Integration Joint Board.



They decide how the money is spent to run services.



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We are Renfrewshire Health and Social Care Partnership. We deliver these services.



Each year more people need help from our services.



Things cost more money now. We must look at ways to save money. We call this Sustainable Futures.



Why might Learning Disability and Physical Disability Day Services change?



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We looked at different ways to save money.



If there are changes to the Learning and Disability and the Physical Disability Day Services this will save money.

Making changes to the Learning Disability and Physical Disability Day Services would save £1,081,000



The law says that we must have some services for people who need help with health and social care. This could be services like home care.

There is no law that says we must have a service like learning disability and physical disability day centres.



If we do not make savings, we may not have enough money to run the services that the law tells us to.



What is the Learning Disability Day Service?



The Learning Disability Day Service provides support to people from five buildings in Renfrewshire.

These buildings are Mirin, Milldale, Anchor, Spinners Gate and Patons.



They support people with a learning disability and autism to build skills and take part in activities in the day centres.



They support people to take part in activities in the community.

What is the Physical Disability Day Service?



The Physical Disability Day Service provides support to people from the Disability Resource Centre.



They support people with a physical disability and additional needs to build skills and take part in activities in the resource centre.



They support people to take part in activities in the community.


The support people need




People need different types of support.

We have to deliver services to the people who need it most.

To help us do this we have four ways to work out what people need.



Critical Need
highest support needs



Substantial Need
high support needs



Moderate Need
some support needs



Low Need
less support needs

What could happen if there are changes to the Learning Disability & Physical Disability Day Services?



The proposal is to bring people together in three buildings instead of six.

These buildings would be:



- A hub in Linwood at On-X Centre



- A hub in Paisley at the Anchor Centre



- A complex care hub in Paisley at Spinners Gate

What could happen if there are changes to the Learning Disability & Physical Disability Day Services?



The proposal is to support people to take part in activities in their local area. People will need support with this.



Some people may need to move to a new hub.



Some people may have changes to how much time they have at a day service.



People who live in supported living may no longer go to a day service.

What could happen if there are changes to the Learning Disability & Physical Disability Day Services?



Carers may need more support if the person they care for moves to a new hub.

Carers may need more support if the person they care for has a change to how much time they have at a day service.



There may be changes for staff who work at the Learning Disability and Physical Disability Day Centres. They may:

- Move to a different day centre
- Get another job in the HSCP
- Or take voluntary redundancy
- Or take early retirement

How would people be supported if there are changes to the Learning & Physical Disability Day Services?



People would have their needs assessed. This will decide what support they need.



People would get support to help them if they move to a new hub.



People would get support to look at other services that could help them.



Carers can get support from Renfrewshire Carers Centre.

What will happen next?



There are events in June. You can have your say about the proposal to make changes to the Learning Disability and Physical Disability Day Services.



What people tell us will help the Integrated Joint Board to decide about making changes to the Learning Disability and Physical Disability Day Services.



The IJB will make a decision at a meeting in September 2025.



If they decide to make changes to the Learning Disability and Physical Disability Day Services this will happen from October 2025.


